From the Director:

Marines -

A legend in our Corps and in our Public Affairs Community died earlier this month. We mourn the passing of **Marine Capt Cyril O'Brien**, combat correspondent and veteran of campaigns on Guadalcanal, Guam, and Iwo Jima. He was 92. Cy attended our conference in Hampton, Va., two years ago. After conferring with today's young corporals, we noted that today's combat correspondents face similar challenges as he did in WWII. And at the same time, Cy noted that today's generation had the "right stuff." I personally still find inspiration today from his work and his life. His <u>correspondence</u> from action on Guam in 1944 remains a compelling report.

From a strategic perspective, we will see the roll-out of several key policy initiatives this month. The organizational communication aspect will be critical.

The implementation of the repeal of **Don't Ask, Don't Tell** is underway and may have significant action with respect to press coverage at the unit level. Ensure you understand the parameters under which you must operate, and call us if you have questions about the media coverage procedures. We expect to publish specific instructions shortly. The intent is meet CMC's guidance to move out smartly on this issue.

The Force Structure Review (FSR) will be announced shortly. It will have implications across the force. Guidance from the FSR is under final development and will be released soon. We will learn in the coming weeks, and will participate in the development, of how the Corps and our communication professionals will be organized for the future security environment.

Many thanks for your continued service and for the sacrifice of your family. I am proud to serve with you.

**NEW Facebook Security: This <u>brief</u> provides detailed instructions on how to enable HTTPS on Facebook. HTTPS is a means to encrypt your connection to Facebook so that anything you send to Facebook can't be used by anyone else who happens to be monitoring you. It is a significant upgrade in security that should have minimal to no impact on how you use Facebook. We encourage everyone to adopt this feature as it becomes available -- Facebook is still rolling out this capability so you may not have the option yet. PLEASE SHARE THIS INFO WITH YOUR COMMANDS.

III MEF/MCBJ

With the holidays and exercises behind us, we all have been busy in Okinawa. Last month we welcomed aboard 2ndLt Jeremy Croft, and 2ndLt Lindsay Pirek joined the Media Section from the Press Section. Additionally, SSgt Leo Salinas and 1stLt Nick Eisenbieser were sent out to Thailand in support of Cobra Gold to provide PA support for the 3d MEB.

1stLt Lucas Burke and Capt Caleb Eames (31st MEU PAO) coordinated the flights of 17 members of the Japanese media and the U.S. Consul General for Okinawa out to the USS Essex (LHD-2) on two CH-46Es for an informational ship's tour. Both sides of the Blue-Green PA team provided an informative tour with the Okinawan media taking away what a "MAGTF" truly encompasses and how it trains and operates. They seemed to have a better understanding of the Navy and Marine Corps forces stationed in Japan, and the capabilities they provide in support of Japan's defense, which resulted in the first "across-the-board" favorable reporting of Marine Corps operations in the past few years. Capt Eames and the rest of the 31st MEU is currently embarked on the Essex Amphibious Ready Group, and underway on their Spring Patrol of the Asia-Pacific region.

The Press Section recently welcomed 1stLt John Norton who returned from a deployment with ISAF and now serves as the Press Officer. Additionally, all Marines participated in the jungle skills training course at the Jungle Warfare Training Center in Northern Okinawa. The course included land navigation, patrolling, jungle survival and concluded with the completion of a 4-mile endurance course.

Lance Cpl Tyler Vernaza recently returned from the 31st MEU and has been replaced by Lance Cpl Garry Welch who joins the MEU's PA team for their spring deployment. We also had the opportunity to welcome Pfc Mark Stroud from the schoolhouse in November.

Several Marines attended a variety of courses at DINFOS to include Cpl Justin Wheeler who graduated from the EJC course, and LCpl Matheus Hernandez who graduated from the BPAS-B course. LCpl Anthony Ward concluded a 6-month OEF IA billet in Guantanamo Bay, Cuba, and reported to DINFOS as a student in the IPC course. In addition to LCpl Jovane Holland and GySgt Jerry Wright deploying in support of Operation Goodwill in December, we currently have five press Marines deployed in support of

Lastly, a DVIDs training team visited Okinawa and provided instruction to all Marines on the proper procedures for setting up and using the system.

The Plans Section is heavily engaged with "exercise season" here in Okinawa. There are more than 20 exercises scheduled during the months of January through April and providing optimal coverage of all participating units is a juggling act of sorts. The office did lose Sgt Rodolfo Toro to MPA duty at RS Buffalo, but were able to get another very capable NCO, Cpl Kentavist Brackin, from the Press Section.

Upon arriving, Cpl Brackin dove head first into our complex training matrix ensuring all of the Marines were scheduled for all annual training requirements as well as the mandatory MarineNet courses. 1stLt Jordan Cochran and GySgt. David Drafton were able to develop support plans for the upcoming exercises. 1stLt Cochran departed for Cobra Gold and was joined by LtCol Griesmer. The units receiving dedicated coverage are 3rd MLG, 3rd MEB and MAG-36. The III MEF/MCBJ CPAO Installation Excellence input was submitted to coincide with the other staff sections.
